## 2019 SECTION 1 - VEGETABLES AND FRUIT

Classes marked \* one variety only. The naming of fruit and vegetables would be appreciated and adds interest for other entrants and visitors

- \*1 Sugar Snap Peas – 6 pods
- \*2 5 spring onions, roots attached
- \*3 5 white potatoes
- \*4 5 coloured potatoes
- 5 Heaviest Potato, weighed
- \*6 6 French Beans
- \*7 1 cucumber
- \*8 4 courgettes (max 6" each)
- \*9 4 carrots, with leaves
- 10 1 bunch of rocket in water
- \*11 5 sticks of rhubarb with approx. 10 cm (4") of leaf blade, base pulled not cut
- 12 Any freak vegetable
- 13 Any other vegetable not listed above (1 only)
- \*14 10 raspberries, with stalks
- \*15 10 blueberries
- \*16 Any other berries, 10
- \*17 5 strigs of any currant
- 18 Small plate of any other fruit, mixed or single variety, judged for quality not quantity
- 19 6 tomatoes – single variety, to be named
- 20 A container of cut herbs in water (4 kinds, 1 of each – not in flower)
- 21 Any other fruit not listed above

## 2019 SECTION 2 – FLOWERS

For the interest of other entrants and visitors, it would be appreciated if varieties could be named

- 22 A vase of garden flowers (at least 3 kinds, 9 stems in all)
- 23 Annual sweet peas – 6 stems
- 24 Fuchsia, 1 stem
- 25 Cluster flowered rose (Floribunda, named) – 1 spray
- 26 A small planted tub, no larger than 30 cm
- 27\* Hybrid tea roses, named – 4 stems mixed
- 28 Specimen bloom of any flower, 1 bloom
- 29 Three stems only of different flowering shrubs in bloom
- 30# A named foliage pot plant
- 31 1 named Clematis flower
- 32 1 Rose, judged for fragrance
- 33 A vase of mixed ornamental foliage, max width 45 cm
- 34 Succulent or cactus
- 35 1 Stem of Lupin, named variety
- 36~ 1 Stem of Delphinium/Hollyhock

# Class 30 – pot not to exceed 18 cm (7") and must have been owned by the entrant for a minimum of 6 months

\* Ostrer Rose Bowl will be awarded to the first prize winner

~ Ron Watts Plate will be awarded to the first prize winner

## 2019 SECTION 3 – FLOWER ARRANGING

Class 37 **On the Edge** – an exhibit to be staged on a Church window sill. Space allowed – min width 100 cm, depth 18 cm, height optional

Class 38 **From the Seashore** – a miniature exhibit incorporating a sea shell. Space allowed – width 10 cm, depth 10 cm, height 15 cm. Exhibits will be staged at different heights

Class 39 **Up the Garden Path** – a petite exhibit. Space allowed width 25 cm, depth 25 cm, height 30 cm

Class 40 **It Takes Two** – an exhibit featuring two placements to be viewed and judged all round. Space allowed – width 60 cm, depth 60 cm, height optional

Class 41 **Trash or Treasure** – an exhibit incorporating an item of recycled plastic. Space allowed – width 40 cm, depth 40 cm, height optional

Class 42 **In the Potting Shed** – an exhibit, may incorporate a growing plant. Space allowed – width 60 cm, depth 60 cm, height optional

Class 43 **Inspired By** – a pedestal exhibit – Title to be shown. (Competitors to supply their own stand)

Any child wishing to enter a flower arrangement class should state their age and they will be judged separately.

*(Best in Show for Flower Arranging will be awarded by public vote)  
Judged to NAFAS rules*

## 2019 SECTION 4 – DOMESTIC

**All items to be covered. Jars should be approx 1lb (454g) clear glass and covered with a wax disc & cellophane or twist top, labelled and dated. No trade marked jars**

- 44 Jar of lemon curd
- 45 Jar of strawberry jam
- 46 Jar of marmalade, 2 or more fruits
- 47 Jar of honey
- 48 Jar of any other jam
- 49 Jar of any jelly
- 50 Jar of chutney
- 51 Small jar of fruit coulis
- 52 1 soda bread loaf
- 53 5 seeded oatcakes
- 54 Victoria Sandwich with raspberry jam filling, 3 egg mixture
- 55 Home-made fudge to this basic recipe, then flavoured to your taste. 300ml evaporated milk, 200g caster sugar, 200g granulated sugar, 50g butter, 1 tsp golden syrup. Line 16cm square tin with non-stick paper. Place ingredients in heavy-based pan and stir to combine. Place on low to medium heat to melt for about 5 mins. Increase heat slightly to gentle rolling boil, stir occasionally so doesn't catch. If you have a sugar thermometer, boil to soft ball stage (116 degrees C) or test after 5-7 mins with a drop in a glass of cold water to form a soft ball. Reduce temp to low and cook for a few mins until the boil has calmed down. Remove from heat and cool for 5 mins. Add flavourings. Beat fudge until thickened and slightly grainy texture/sound. Pour quickly into tin and leave to set for 3 hours or until cold. Turn out and cut into 36 squares approx. Please label with flavourings.
- 56 Bread Pudding, 4 pieces, please provide own recipe
- 57 4 Scotch Pancakes
- 58 A bottle of home-made cordial or fruit drink (non-alcoholic)
- 59 A bottle of home-made wine or liqueur
- 60 3 eggs, named single chicken variety, one to be broken by judge in clear dish provided by entrant. Chickens to be owned by entrant

A cup will be given for Judges Award for jam and preserves
